Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for responding to our School Uniform Survey. Below are the key points of information:

- The overwhelming majority of parents and carers agreed that uniform is important.
- 62% agreed that uniform is expensive
- 17% would help to set up a Pre-loved Uniform Shop
- The overwhelming majority of parents and carers agreed that we should change to a plain blue or black PE T-shirt (White getting too dirty, too quickly)
- The overwhelming majority of parents and carers agreed that the school logo is an important part of the uniform
- A minority of parents and carers agreed that they would buy the logo separately
- The overwhelming majority of parents and carers agreed that their children frequently lose their uniform
- Many parents and carers told us that the blue sweatshirts from Trophy Textiles didn't wash well.

As a result we will be updating our Uniform Guide for September 2022. This will be emailed to all parents and carers before the end of term.

I look forward to seeing you at our Summer Fair - thank you for your support and donations. The PTA makes a valuable contribution to the school enabling us to buy resources that would otherwise be impossible to purchase. Currently the PTA is very small, and would really appreciate more parents getting involved. If you would like to help organise social and fundraising events, please email the school, and we'll pass on your contact details to Sam Elcox, who is making everything possible almost single handedly!


