

Trip to Charlestown Shipwreck Museum



We were lucky enough to visit the Tunnel of Lights: an Arctic Experience! This helped us to imagine what it might have been like on board an explorers ship, and what it might have been like to visit the polar regions as an explorer.



In the museum we got to see different treasures that have been found and rescued from shipwrecks. We thought about why people might dive to locate and explore shipwrecks, and what we can learn from what they find.



We became explorers ourselves, exploring one of the beaches in Charlestown! Lots of us found interesting shells and some unique pieces of sea glass.
